Eminent Archon Report

2023 has been a year full of challenges and opportunities for improvement at Oregon Alpha. We began this school year by recruiting a freshmen class of around 32, thanks to the excellence and persistence of our three recruitment chairmen Brett Beyer '24, Cole Van Valin '24, and Amir Fenderski '23. The chapter elected to experiment with three recruitment chairmen as opposed to the traditional two, and the results of this experiment were successful. This large class contributed to the brotherhood right away, and they are well on their way to becoming True Gentlemen.

While Fall saw the chapter experience a bit of academic hardship, recently elected scholarship chairmen Ethan Clark '24 and Javier Ruiz '25 implemented new strategies and quickly got the chapter back on track. Winter term was massive in terms of academic improvement. The house GPA rose drastically to over a 3.0 and the most improvement was seen in the freshmen class. Winter was a great opportunity to improve the chapter's internal processes. The slower pace of the term allowed new officers to get accommodated into their new roles, and the improvement in scholarship and brotherhood was felt throughout the house.

Spring term was much faster paced, but the executive team was well equipped to handle it. For starters, Mom's Weekend was a massive success for the second year in a row at Oregon Alpha. EDA Brody LaFontaine did an excellent job of coordinating the event with the Mom's Club and ensuring that our dinner, brunch, and live music would be satisfactory

for our families. The weekend saw the chapter raise over \$23,000 for the Minerva Mom's Club fund, and families had a great time listening to live music on our basketball court and socializing with their sons and other families of SAE.

The term concluded with another excellent Awards Banquet held at the chapter house. The banquet gave us all an opportunity to recognize excellence within the chapter and honor the graduating seniors who will be beginning their careers shortly. We were also able to acknowledge chapter advisor, Will Later '12, who was the recipient of the Chapter Advisor of the Year award from the university. The banquet was also an excellent example of lifelong brotherhood within the SAE chapter. Having alumni collaborations is something that makes our chapter special and it is a great reminder to all classes that SAE stays with you after you graduate. We have Scott Spiegelberg '75 and Dick Thompson '73 to thank for the excellent alumni-chapter relationship.

While this year was challenging in many ways, it was yet another example of why our chapter is special. We persevered through hardship and came out better on the other side. I am extremely proud of the accomplishments that Oregon Alpha has made this year and I am looking forward to getting back to work in the Fall.


Will Later '12 Chapter Advisor of the Year


