



EA Report: Strong Campus Involvement, Philanthropic Success



The 2011-2012 school year at Oregon Alpha was rewarding and exciting. Looking back on my four years living at 2929, I could not have imagined another place to call home.

In summer 2011, with the help of the Alumni Association, five brothers of Oregon Alpha were able to attend the 76th annual John O. Moseley Leadership School. I attended the same school the year before, and I can honestly say it was one of the most rewarding events of my four years as an undergrad. The people we met, along with the ideas and leadership opportunities that we absorbed and brought back to Corvallis, made for a priceless experience.

Also last summer, Brother Michael Hales (current EA and past EDA) and I had the opportunity to attend the biennial Sigma Alpha Epsilon Convention in Memphis, TN. Here we got to experience the business of the fraternity. We also gained a greater sense of how many national alumni there are and what they have done in their fraternal and professional careers. Our Oregon Alpha Alumni Association received some great awards for our newsletter as well as recognition for our alumni involvement.

Before the start of the fall quarter, the rest of the exec board and I spent a few days planning goals and bonding before the rest of the members arrived at the fraternity house. This experience was crucial to our success as a council in the fall, and paved the way for the strong group we have leading the chapter now. One of our main

goals was to recruit a class of quality guys. Our two recruitment chairs, Travis Felchlin and Kaz Azizian, were able to recruit 53 new pledges, the highest number for any fraternity at Jump Day last fall.

Our recruitment success was only the first of many achievements and highlights for fall term. A few weeks into the term, we competed in one of the largest philanthropies on campus — Delta Gamma's Anchor Splash. The strength of our brotherhood that week was incredible for so early in the school year. So much so that we ended up winning the philanthropy!

Fall term, we did a lot of work with SAE National. We had our yearly visit from our Regional Director, Steve Kronenburg. He visited with all of the officers in the house,





It was the best summit day of the year, no question," Craig said in a Statesman Journal article, adding: "again I tip my hat to International Mountain Guides: they're very good. They have a great history of getting it right, and they nailed it." He is believed to be the first former NFL, NBA, or major league athlete to reach the summit of the world's tallest mountain. Craig is a former Oregon State football team captain, and played in the National Football League from 1972 to 1975. Following his NFL career, Craig worked as the Government Affairs Manager for Willamette Industries, and later as the President of the Oregon Forest Industries Council. Craig also served as a Polk County Commissioner.

DOUG TODD '73 continues his work as Director of Governmental Affairs for Siemens Corporation in our nation's capital. His son, John, is a freshman at Mississippi State and pledged SAE. "Nancy and I attended the dinner following the ceremony. I dusted off my pin, and am really proud of John!"



GREG STROBEL '74 became a distinguished member of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame during the Honors Weekend Banquet and Induction Ceremony in Stillwater, Oklahoma, June 1-2, 2012. As a Beaver, Strobel was 126-8-1, for an incredible .940 winning percentage. He was a three-time NCAA All-American, three-time Pacific 8 Conference champ, and a two-time NCAA title winner. As a junior, Strobel won his first national title at 190 pounds with an 11-7 win over Northern Illinois'

Johnny Johnson, and was named Outstanding Wrestler at the 1973 NCAAs. He finished the season at 39-0, and continued his unbeaten streak into the 1974 season. Strobel capped his senior season with another NCAA title and a winning streak of 77 matches, defeating Ben Ohai of Brigham Young University. ROB BROWN '73 and DAN KEUTER '73 attended the ceremony.

SCOTT SPIEGELBERG '75 is the Coordinator of Career Services for Graduate Programs for the OSU College of Business. He recruits students to the MBA program, and then works to place graduates into jobs and careers. Scott and Peggy have a daughter, Annie, who will be a junior and is a member of Chi Omega. 
