## Oregon Alpha Receives Chapter Achievement Award at Leadership School

This year, Oregon Alpha was recognized with the Chapter Achievement Award, which is earned by chapters that excel in the core fundamental areas of chapter operations.

## **Chapter Advisor's Report**

As an undergraduate member of SAE, I was fortunate enough to attend two large scale events put on by the National Fraternity. The first was the 75th John O. Moseley Leadership School in Miami, and the second was the 2011 Convention in Memphis. My third event, the Alumni Advisor Training at the 83rd John O. Moseley Leadership School in Phoenix, was just as special as the previous two.

The program was facilitated by Jesus Maldonado, the Province Archon for Province Chi. The four other alumni in the group were Michael Demere, Tennessee Kappa; Bill Farr, Oklahoma Mu; Chase Johnson, Kentucky Epsilon; and John Antonio, Province Upsilon Archon.

The few days spent talking with these brothers about different issues that face our fraternity, and the Greek system as a whole, gave me some great perspective.

The most dynamic conversations we had centered around the changes in university landscapes, understanding why we are advisors, and some extra training on how to improve communications and conversations with the collegiate members of our chapters.

The most impactful session by far was the "Love, Mom and Dad" presentation. Three families, each of whom had lost a son due to hazing, shared their stories for about an hour and a half. Listening to the raw emotion and sadness behind their stories was, as one of the other advisors put it, "like someone just grabbed your heart and started to squeeze." None of the families' sons were SAEs, but they were willing to come to one of our largest events and share their stories.

After that presentation, we had our last breakout session with the other advisors. With a few tears around the table, we got to talking about how to prevent such incidents in the future. The ideas ranged from implementing changes in our national structure to holding the most honest conversations possible with our members, letting them know that any actions that fall outside of the fraternity's core values and principles will be dealt with immediately and with zero tolerance.

Our attendance at events like these provides extra inspiration to work with our members and alumni at Oregon State and beyond. One of my goals after attending this great event is to join the faculty of the Western States Leadership School in Las Vegas.

# **Eminent Archon Report**



The Oregon Alpha Chapter of SAE has completed another monumental year, maintaining high scholastic standards and excelling in community service and leadership.

This year was also a time for adaptation to the changing culture around fraternities, as national headlines spotlighted issues associated with fraternities across the nation. Many colleges suspended Greek Life

indefinitely at one point or another, due to hazing and drinking related deaths. The Sigma Alpha Epsilon Supreme Council wanted to get ahead of these issues before they reached our organization, and imposed the first "social moratorium" or "social pause," with all social activities suspended for three months. During this time, they asked undergraduate brothers for advice on how we can hold safe social events and ensure that everyone follows risk management policies. The Supreme Council consulted health and safety experts, and came up with a set of guidelines post-moratorium to further enhance our safe social practices: dry periods for the first week of school and the days leading up to and including finals week; limitation of beverages served at social events to 14% ABV or less; and promotion of each chapter's health and safety officer to the executive board. The social pause gave the brothers of Oregon Alpha a chance to take a step back and reflect on what it means to be fraternity men, and why we originally joined.

We started out the year with three goals: to win a philanthropy event hosted by another organization on campus, to increase our number of hours devoted to community service, and to be nominated for the John O. Moseley Fraternity Zeal Award, which is awarded to the best SAE chapter in the nation.

In the spring, we met our first goal by winning not one, but two philanthropies. In Kappa Kappa Gamma's annual "Kappa's in the Key 3 on 3" basketball tournament, two of our teams played each other in the final game, securing us an overall victory. Our own Tug-of-War philanthropy, now in its third year and including a new raffle, raised nearly \$10,000 for Samaritan Health's Mario Pastega House. Ken Pastega was in attendance, and shared some kind words about how our fraternity has benefited families who have stayed at the house and helped fund improvements to the house.

We achieved our second goal as brothers stepped up to the challenge and completed more than 2,000 hours of community

service. Some of our major events included a park cleanup at Chintimini Park and the Adopt-a-Highway program we participate in every term on Hwy. 99 south of town. A few individuals went above and beyond, including Braden Vogt '18, who volunteers as a youth mentor for kids at the College Hill High School, and Jakob Eisenbeiss '21, who is a volunteer firefighter in Corvallis.

After a successful visit with our Coordinator of Chapter Development, Travis Tafoya, we were nominated for both the Chapter Achievement Award and the Zeal Award. Travis was impressed with all we had accomplished in brotherhood, leadership, and campus involvement.

We continued to lead academically, earning an overall GPA of 3.08 in the fall, 3.04 in the winter, and 3.12 in the spring, topping the all-men's average GPAs for those terms. Winter term, our first-year members finished with a 3.15, the highest first-year members' GPA of all Greek organizations on campus.

This year has had its challenges, with another young executive team consisting of mostly underclassmen, but as in years prior, they exceeded expectations and continued the tradition of developing True Gentlemen while promoting the highest standards. We anticipate another strong fall recruitment, and will continue to improve our organization and encourage our members to be the best they can be.


