Sigma Alpha Epsilon held its 87th John O. Moseley Leadership School this past January 8-11 in Chicago, IL with more than 400 undergraduate members in attendance. Leadership School is SAE's flagship leadership development program, offering an immersive weekend of education, networking, and brotherhood-building for collegiate members. The program focuses on building leadership skills and competencies needed to be a successful leader in all facets of life.

Supported by alumni contributions, Oregon Alpha was able to send Eminent Archon Hank Vande Brake '27, Eminent Deputy Archon Mason Gray '27, and Eminent Treasurer Nick Ferrero '27.

Leadership School emphasizes:

- **Leadership skills** — planning, execution, communication, and problem-solving.
- **Fraternity connection** — building bonds with peers and alumni.
- **Professional preparation** — preparing for future roles in leadership and service.

The John O. Moseley Leadership School is both a historic tradition and a modern leadership development platform, blending SAE's brotherhood culture with practical leadership training for the next generation of leaders.

EDA Mason Gray provided the following report: "Attending Leadership School in Chicago was a meaningful experience that strengthened my understanding of leadership and my responsibilities as Vice President. Being surrounded by members from chapters across the country made it clear that while each chapter faces unique challenges, many of our goals and obstacles are shared. Listening to how other chapters approach recruitment, accountability, and brotherhood gave me new perspectives and practical ideas that I can bring back to Oregon Alpha. One of the most valuable aspects of the experience was learning directly from alumni who have previously held leadership roles. Their insight into navigating difficult decisions, maintaining chapter standards, and balancing fraternity responsibilities with academics and personal growth helped me better understand the long-term impact

of strong leadership. Overall, Leadership School helped me reflect on how I can be more intentional in my role as Vice President by supporting the executive board, holding brothers accountable, and helping create a chapter culture built on respect and responsibility. 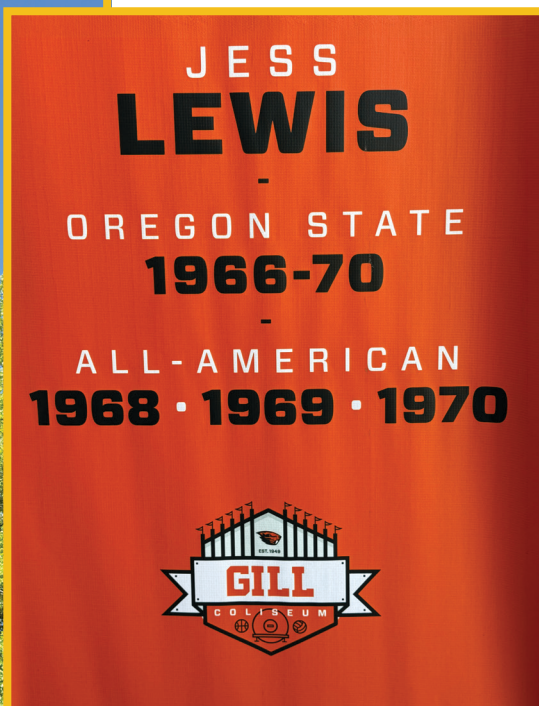
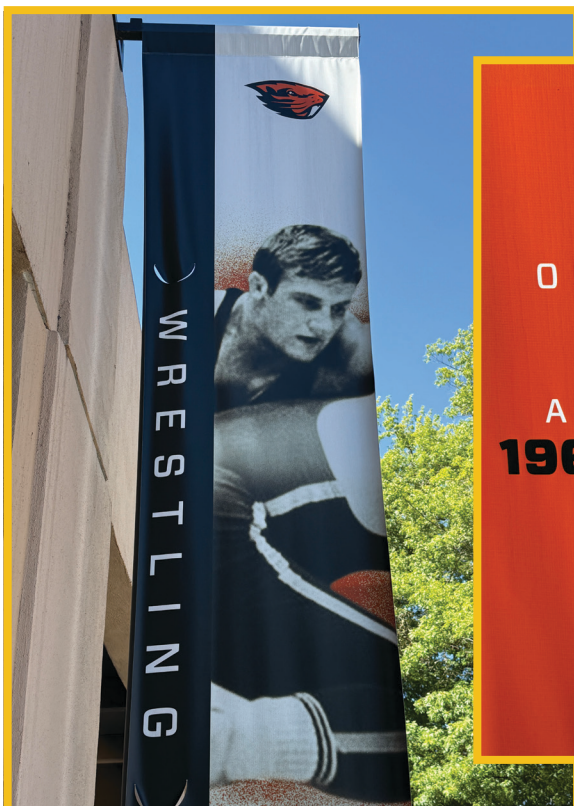

Speaking for the 4th time, our guest speaker was legendary OSU All-America Football player and 2-time NCAA Heavyweight Wrestling Champion, Jess Lewis '69! Brother Lewis shared some of his most memorable highlights with the young brothers including the fact that he never lost to the Ducks and recalling his famous open field tackle of OJ Simpson in the 1967 OSU vs #1 USC game, which many have considered the greatest play in the most memorable upset by an OSU team in its history. That tackle prevented OJ from scoring a sure touchdown and helped the Beavs hang on to win 3-0!

Attendees span some 74 years, from Hal Engelen '55 to Oregon Alpha's current Freshman of the Year Owen Woltze '29. Our guest speaker was Eminent Supreme Chronicler Dave Griego. And in attendance were 14 members who were all initiated in 1976 and each was presented with a Minerva's Golden Sons 50 Year Certificate.

Attendees had time to reflect on how it all began. "It was Sunday, March 9, 1856. Noble Leslie Devotie and seven like-minded University of Alabama students gathered in Tuscaloosa with an idea, an idea that would outlast them all. They believed young men needed more than any campus organization could provide. Students needed a family, one grounded in friendship, scholarship, leadership, and service. They needed a home, a firm foundation, and a bond deep enough to last a lifetime.

SAE's 170th Founders' Day is a time to celebrate the enduring impact of the fraternity's ideals in our own lives. Today, more than 377,000 initiated brothers stand as proof that the founder's vision still matters.

The legacy of brotherhood we inherited is literally built on generations of True Gentlemen committed to the principles set forth by our fraternal forefathers."
